## Attendance

The report attached gives a percentage attendance for your child. All students should aim for 100% attendance to maximise their chance of academic success. The below table provides an indication of lost learning time for attendance levels below 100%.

## Credits

The reward system at Oak Academy is based upon a credit system. Students are awarded credits for high quality work and for displaying positive behaviours as summarised in the table below. At the end of each half term a rewards assembly is held where credits are recognised.

## Attitude to Learning and Home Learning

The 'Attitude to Learning and Home Learning' level is an indicator of how an individual student is applying themselves to their studies. Expectation is that all students should be gaining a 1 or 2 for this criteria, irrelevant of academic ability.

## Improvement Action

In each subject a student receives a short written target on how to improve their skill. This is an aspect of the subject that, through assessment, their teacher has identified they need to improve. Students will be addressing these in lesson and in homework tasks. Additional support at home will also ensure students make progress towards their targets.

## Academic

### Target grades

All students enter the Academy with Key Stage 2 (KS2) results from Year 6 assessments. Aspirational targets for students are set based upon these Year 6 assessments as follows:

English – set based upon KS2 English level;

Maths – set based upon KS2 Maths level;

All other subjects – set based upon Average KS2 level;

Their End of Year target reflects the grade they expected to achieve by the end of this year in order to reach their final End of Year 11 target.

### Current Grade

Students are given a grade to indicate the level they are currently working at. This grade will be colour coded to indicate whether your child is on track to meet their target grade. Please use the key to understand how your child's current grade relates to their target. With the aspirational targets set, at the start of the year it is possible that some students will have a current grade 'below expected'. It is important that improvement actions are adhered to, to ensure future student progress.

### GCSE Grades – understanding the new Government system

For some subjects students are now assessed using new numerical Grades. Below is a grid that allows you to compare the new grading system to the one previous.

Other subjects are yet to change to the numerical system and therefore your child's grades will be made up of a mixture of numbers and letters.

### Vocational Subjects

Some more practical subjects follow a different grading system.

Here is a list of possible grades that can be achieved and their equivalence to previous GCSE grades.

L1P	Level 1 Pass	E
L2P	Level 2 Pass	C
L2M	Level 2 Merit	B
L2D	Level 2 Distinction	A
L2D*	Level 2 Distinction*	A*

Within the GCSE/Vocational grade students will also be given a fine grade that will allow you to see how secure your child is within this grade. The table is an example of what the fine grades mean.

4+	Could soon achieve Grade 5 with intervention
4=	Secure in Grade 4
4-	Unsecure - intervention required to secure Grade 4
